
Very hard work is behind every league title. And today I want to express my deep gratitude to all those who gave their all to win the title.

CEO report

We've gone through a difficult season, which was full of vivid emotions, interesting matches, spectacular wins, records and achievements. We showed again that in the toughest circumstances our club looks only forward, that it doesn't give up and moves towards the set goal. Shakhtar has confirmed its being the best in Ukraine with its performance and successes.

For the first time in 13 years, the club invited the new head coach. Many teams from the top European leagues wanted to see Paulo Fonseca as their coach, but we managed to convince him to join Shakhtar. And, as the season reveals, we weren't mistaken. The Ukrainian league format also changed. The formula suggested by Shakhtar made the Premier League interesting for fans and attractive for sponsors, with the participants getting a more honest competition and quality matches.

The club life saw several significant events happen. Darijo Srna made his 500th appearance in Shakhtar shirt and turned out to be the first player to have conquered this milestone. This is the captain's unique achievement, which won't be easy to repeat. History is being made right in front of our eyes.

Shakhtar's move to Kharkiv was an important stage. For two and a half years we played our home games at the Arena Lviv, being grateful to the city and its inhabitants for the support. On 9 September 2016, Shakhtar played a league game vs Dynamo in Kharkiv. This meeting at the OSC Metalist gathered 39,677 fans, with many of them coming specially from Donetsk. Therefore, we decided

that Shakhtar would receive its opponents in Kharkiv in 2017.

Some people might get concerned about the start of the season as we lost the Ukrainian Super Cup tie and didn't make it to the Champions League group stage. However, challenges just harden our character and make us stronger. Later, the team of Paulo Fonseca did not give reasons for doubting their high level. Shakhtar became the best in the Europa League group stage, claiming major wins in all six matches. We also performed consistently in the league season's first part - with no defeats and a spectacular 4-3 win over Dynamo at the NSC Olympiyskyi. We left for the winter break as the league leaders with +13 points in the competition table.

It's nice that the team's pupils play an increasingly big role in its victories. The squad renewal is a natural process for football. The career of the legend Vyacheslav Shevchuk ended up this winter, Eduardo also left Shakhtar. A bit later we said goodbye to Olexandr Kucher, Anton Kanibolotskyi and Vasyl Kobin. Each of them left a bright mark in the history of the club, helping us win many trophies. We want to tell them thank you for the years spent at Shakhtar, wishing them good luck and more achievements in the sport and life alike.

In the spring the team were confidently moving towards the title, with Paulo Fonseca actively deploying the young players as the first team regulars. 9 graduates of the Shakhtar Academy appeared in the starting line-up against Oleksandriia. Shakhtar became the base club for Ukraine national team, with its 15 players getting on the Ukraine roster for the

World Cup qualifiers. That's a great success for our entire club.

May 6, 2017 is the day we were very much looking forward to and which will go down in the history of the football club Shakhtar. Having defeated Zorya in Kharkiv, the team became the champions of Ukraine for the tenth time! This victory was just as beautiful and dramatic as the whole season. We covered a long way to claim our milestone gold medals, we so much wanted to keep them in our hands. For the sake of our goal we didn't give up, we continued working hard and achieved that success deservedly. Those gold medals are the achievement of Shakhtar president Rinat Akhmetov, the coaches, the players, the club employees and of all our fans! We can again say with pride: "Shakhtar are the Champs!" The domestic Cup triumph and the golden double only confirmed that Shakhtar are second to none in the Ukrainian football.

We have the Champions League campaign ahead, the domestic league and Cup competitions ... An interesting season awaits us, along with new challenges. Our goals remain the same: winning every match, confident performance on the European stage and new trophies. We showed that we have the champions spirit and that despite the difficulties, we can win titles. And these days as never before, we want to win!

Donbass Arena

Shakhtar's home ground has not hosted any football matches for three consecutive seasons now due to the military conflict in Donbass.

In March 2017, the SCM Group declared a complete loss of control over all of its assets located in the temporarily uncontrolled territories in Donetsk and Luhansk regions.

The Donbass Arena is one of them.

Also, they were forced to stop distributing humanitarian aid of the Aid+Help Centre at the stadium.

Arena Lviv

In the first part of the season, Shakhtar held their home games in Lviv.
From July to December 2016, the Miners played six Ukrainian League games and one domestic Cup Round of 16 tie vs Oleksandriia at the Arena Lviv. The Donetsk team claimed wins on all occasions.

In the Champions League qualifying round, the team of Paulo Fonseca received Young Boys (SUI). They also entertained Braga (POR), Gent (BEL), along with Instanbul Basaksehir and Konyaspor (TUR) in the Europa League. The Miners won all 5 home games, scoring 15 goals and conceding none. Aggregately, the meetings in Lviv were attended by 48,955 spectators.

OSC Metalist

Before the winter break, the Orange-and-Blacks played two games in Kharkiv as hosts. The meeting with Dynamo in September 2016 ended in a 1-1 draw; in November the Donetsk team secured a 2-1 victory over Karpaty.


OSC Metalist became the team's main arena for home matches in 2017. Shakhtar covered the stadium maintenance costs. In the Europa League round of 32 return leg, the Miners received Celta (ESP) in Kharkiv. After that, the stadium hosted another six Premier League games and two Ukrainian Cup ones.

In February, they opened a Fan Shop covering the floor area of 400 sq.m. at the stadium.

STB Kirsha

Kirsha sports & training base is located 15 km away from Donetsk, being a structural division of the Sports Facilities Department of FC Shakhtar.

Due to hostilities in the region, the training fields and other facilities of the centre were not operated. The infrastructure was maintained to the minimally required standards.

On the 1st March 2017, the club lost control over administering STB Kirsha.

The sports and training base was mothballed, with the facility operations being suspended.













Sviatoshyn base

During the season, Shakhtar trained at the sports base of Sviatoshyn located 20 kilometres away from Kyiv. The Orange-and-Blacks had at their disposal a swimming pool, a sauna, a fitness centre, a room for theory sessions, a room for massage and a football pitch which was prepared for training sessions by the groundsmen of the Donetsk club's field maintenance service.

Season review



For three consecutive years Shakhtar were based outside of Donetsk. Training in Kyiv, the team played their home games in Lviv, also playing at the OSC Metalist in Kharkiv in 2017.

The Miners started the football year under the leadership of a new mentor Paulo Fonseca. In the Ukrainian Super Cup decider, the Orange-and-Blacks met with Dynamo for the ninth time in their history. The Donetsk team took the lead in the second half thanks to a goal by Fred, with Vida equalising just ten minutes away from time. The trophy's future was decided in a penalty shootout, with the Kyiv side being luckier.

For the first time in the last 6 seasons, Shakhtar did not qualify for the UEFA Champions League group stage. In the third qualifying round, the team locked horns with Young Boys (SUI). After the home triumph (2-o), the Orange-and-Blacks suffered an away defeat with the same score. The opponents proved luckier in the penalty shootout.

In the autumn part of the season, the Miners proved themselves in another European competition – the Europa League. Two victories over Istanbul Basaksehir allowed them to qualify for the group stage. In the quartet with Konyaspor (TUR), Braga (POR) and Gent (BEL), Shakhtar won all six games, becoming the most prolific side and being recognized as the best group stage team of the tournament.
















European club cup campaign continued in February with the knockout games against Celta (ESP). The first leg in Vigo was won by Paulo Fonseca's men (1-o), with the only goal being netted by the club newcomer Gustavo Blanco Leschuk. In the return leg in Kharkiv everything was decided by a penalty shot, which had been awarded by the referee against Shakhtar in the 90th minute. The face-off went into extra time, with the Spaniards scoring the winner (o-2). The Orangeand-Blacks' campaign in European competitions finished in the Europa League round of 32.




In the Ukrainian League, the Miners were second to none. The Donetsk side passed the first half of the year without defeats. The team held one of the most important matches in terms of emotional charge and confidence in their own strength on August 12 in Lviv: Karpaty were 2-0 in front before the break, however, the second-half goals by Taras Stepanenko, Viktor Kovalenko and Marlos brought Shakhtar a comeback win.

The Orange-and-Blacks proved their superiority in the games against their major competitors. After being tied in Kharkiv, Paulo Fonseca's men defeated Dynamo Kyiv 4-3 in Kyiv, leaving for the winter break with an advantage of 13 points.



The championship was held in new format for the first time: after the first stage, the participants continued competing in two groups by six teams according to the claimed spots. In the second part of the season, Shakhtar again proved stronger on Dynamo's pitch (1-0, the goal scored by Facundo Ferreyra).

In general, the Donetsk outfit delivered a consistent performance and secured 25 victories in the season. They won the title in the game vs Zorya four rounds away from the season end, which is the tenth in the club history. In Kharkiv on May 17, Shakhtar once again defeated Dynamo and secured the 'golden double' in the Ukrainian Cup final (1-0, the goal scored by Marlos).






















During the winter break, the club signed up striker Gustavo Blanco Leschuk. The Argentinian, who used to play in the Ukrainian Premier League for Karpaty Lviv, signed a deal with Shakhtar for 3.5 years.







In the 2016/17 season, Valeriy Kryventsov was in charge of Shakhtar U21, whose coaching staff included Yevhen Kotov, Dmytro Shutkov and Volodymyr Rashevskyi. On 6 August 2014, they established the Rinat Akhmetov Humanitarian Centre to render assistance to the civilians in Donetsk and Luhansk Oblasts affected by the hostilities. The Centre has combined resources of Ukraine Development Foundation and the businesses of SCM Group and FC Shakhtar.

On 28 February 2017, armed men blocked the operation of HC at the Donbass Arena and all distribution outlets. They sealed up about 70 thousand survival kits for adults and children. On March 2, they announced at the joint press briefing of the Centre and FC Shakhtar management that 1 million and 145 thousand people had received aid in two and a half years.

Come On, Let's Play!

Since its launching in 2013, the geography of the grassroots football project has expanded to 7 Ukrainian cities. During the reporting period, children aged 7 to 12 years old had regular training sessions in Donetsk, Makiyivka, Lviv, Kramatorsk, Kurakhove, Severodonetsk and Dobropillya. Young sportsmen had been training on quality playgrounds under the guidance of volunteer coaches trained by the Shakhtar Academy experts.






Aiding a Hospital in Kharkiv

The first live broadcast for Shakhtar fans abroad was held on January 22, 2017, when Paulo Fonseca's men had a friendly match against Cracovia, Poland.


